Dear Parents/Carers,

The children have settled into Year 1 excellently so far. It has been wonderful to see so many children entering the classroom with smiling faces, ready to learn! We have just started to incorporate more lessons into our daily timetable and the children have managed really well. Year 1 is one of the trickiest transitions for children so we have been really impressed by how they have been getting on.

The children will be continuing their journey along the Homerswood Pathway Curriculum, which encourages children to grow, be curious and discover.

The table below shows some of the learning we will be doing in Year 1 as well as some websites to help you to support your child from home.

Subject	Topics covered and how to support your child.
English	Focus: Using Capital Letters, Full Stops and Finger Spaces. Writing single clause sentences. Being able to spell some common exception words. Join two clauses with simple conjunctions. Phonics: Our focus for the first term in Year 1 is on Phase 3 phonics so regular practice at home with Phase 3 would be helpful. Practicing writing and spelling tricky words and the Year 1 common exception words would also be very useful. Science	Focus: Animals including Humans: All about me In this topic, the children will learn about the basic parts of the human body and explore their five senses. Focus: Exploring Everyday Materials 1

	<p>In this topic, the children will learn how to distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made. They will also be identifying different types of materials such as wood, plastic, metal, glass, water and rock.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/z6svr82</p>
History	<p>Focus: How am I making history?</p> <p>In this topic, the children will order photos on a timeline, share and place a memory, and explain why memories are special. Name yearly celebrations, ways to celebrate birthdays, explore childhoods in the past, compare past and present childhoods, add items to a time capsule, and use key words to compare time periods.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zc9s6g8</p>
Geography	<p>Focus: What is it like here?</p> <p>In this topic, the children will be learning about where they live. The children will develop locational knowledge based on the view from the school and local areas. Computing	<p>Focus: Exploring chromebooks</p> <p>Staying safe online</p> <p>Exploring Purple Mash</p> <p>Grouping and sorting</p> <p>https://www.purplemash.com/sch/homerswood</p>
Art	<p>Focus: Drawing: Exploring line and shape</p> <p>In this unit, children will be exploring line and shape; working and experimenting with different materials through observational and collaborative pieces inspired by artists.</p>
Design and Technology	<p>Focus: Structures: Stable structures</p> <p>In this topic, the children will be exploring the stability of structures and making a stable pencil pot for a specific user.</p>
PE	<p>As in all PE units, pupils develop physical, social, emotional and thinking whole child objectives.</p> <p>Fundamental Skills - Pupils will explore the fundamental skills of balancing, running, changing direction, jumping, hopping and skipping. They will explore these skills in isolation as well as in combination.</p> <p>Ball Skills - In this unit pupils will explore and develop their fundamental ball skills such as throwing and catching, rolling and dribbling with both hands and feet. They will look to perform these skills with increasing control and accuracy using co-ordination and balance. Pupils will have the opportunity to work independently, and collaboratively in pairs and small groups.</p>

	<p>Striking and Fielding Games - In this unit, pupils develop their understanding of the principles of defending (fielding) and attacking (batting) for striking and fielding games. They use and develop skills such as throwing and catching, tracking a ball and striking a ball.</p> <p>Sending and Receiving - In this unit pupils develop their sending and receiving skills including throwing and catching, rolling, kicking, tracking and stopping a ball. Pupils will be given opportunities to work with a range of different sized balls. They will apply their skills individually, in pairs and in small groups and begin to organise and self-manage their own activities. They will understand the importance of abiding by the rules to keep themselves and others safe.</p>
Music	<p>Focus: Colonel Hathi's March Menu Song</p>
RE	<p>Focus: Christianity In this topic, the children will be learning about Christianity and developing their enquiry skills. Our enquiry questions are 'Who do Christians say made the world?' and 'Why does Christmas matter to Christians?'. www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zdykjsx</p>
