



## **Homerswood Primary and Nursery School School Uniform**

School uniforms are expected to be worn by all children during school hours.

- White polo shirt preferably with school logo
- Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt, pinafore or blue & white check dress
- Nursery & Reception ONLY navy blue jogging bottoms
- Grey or white socks
- PE kit - Navy blue shorts, navy jogging bottoms and white PE T-shirt with school logo. Trainers.

It is essential that all items must be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Footwear Outdoor shoes must be practical and preferably not trainers.

Availability - School sweatshirts, cardigans, polo shirts, PE T-shirts, summer caps, water bottles, book bags and PE/shoe bags can be obtained from the school office online:

Jewellery - watches only are permitted.

Hair/Earrings - for safety and hygiene reasons, long hair must always be tied back with blue/white bands. All but the shortest hair should be tied up. Hair that touches the collar, or a fringe that falls into the eyes, should be tied up or clipped back.

Hair accessories should be practical for school and should be blue or white.

The school does not permit children to have 'extreme' haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. This includes patterns cut into the hair, Mohican styles, artificial colours, or spiking. The definition of an extreme hairstyle is at the discretion of the Headteacher.

Stud earrings only are allowed and these should be removed or covered for PE. These must be removed or covered by the child themselves.

Nail varnish is not permitted.

Personal Property must only be brought into school with permission from a teacher. These items should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Toys and other valuable items must not be brought into school.

The school cannot accept any responsibility in respect of loss or damage to personal belongings.
